

To showcase the talent and expertise that refugees bring with them to the UK. To explore new and creative ways of addressing the relevant issues and reach beyond the refugee sector and provide information which educates and raises awareness of the reality of refugee experiences

Refugee Week aims to provide an important opportunity for asylum seekers and refugees to be seen, listened to and valued. The ultimate aim is to create better understanding between different communities and to encourage successful integration, enabling refugees to live in safety.
